With effect from 2nd October 2017, the tariffs shown will apply to work undertaken by PGRs who teach. In addition, a new hourly rate of pay will apply to Tutor work (grade 5 point 23). The hourly pay rate for PGRs has been determined by reviewing the tasks undertaken to understand the appropriate pay range, and consider potential comparators to inform the appropriate hourly rate. The tariffs have been determined using guidance from the Code of Practice to ensure recognition for the full range of activities a PGR student might undertake and their commensurate reward.

Rates of Pay:

Graduate Tutor - Grade 5 point 23 (currently £14.51 per hour)

Graduate Demonstrator – Grade 4 point 16 (currently £11.82 per hour)

Hours of work

Full-time PGRs should not spend more than an average of six hours per week engaged in teaching activities during semester time, and no more than 180 hours per academic year. These figures include class contact, preparation, marking, feedback and administration, but not training

Students who hold a Tier 4 visa

Students on a Tier 4 visa, must not undertake more than 20 hours paid/unpaid employment per week. This is an <u>absolute maximum</u> number of hours, not an average figure, and includes teaching commitments (preparation, contact hours, marking, feedback, administration, training etc.) <u>as well as any other employment within or outside the University.</u>
