The Role:

The Mental Health Officer is elected to represent the mental wellbeing of all students. It is a voluntary role, and the successful candidate will carry out the role alongside their studies. All elected officers will be given training and support to carry out their role, so no previous experience is needed.

The Mental Health Officer will:

- Represent the mental wellbeing of all students
- Raise awareness and promote the interests of the students they represent
- Lobby for changes across the university
- Plan and run campaigns
- Serve as president of the Mental Health Network
- Engage in the Students' Union's democratic processes
- Attend Students' Union meetings and regularly liaise with key staff

Campaign Officers are asked to regularly check their emails and communicate with us and be enthusiastic towards the role. Additionally, there is a set of requirements which Campaign Officers are expected to complete throughout the year. These include, but may not be limited to:

- Attend training with the Students' Union
- Attend Student Senate
- Provide accountability updates at Student Senate
- Provide additional accountability updates throughout the year
- Attend the Annual General Meeting
- Attend Officers' Executive Committee meetings
- Run network elections
- Run an individual campaign
