Agenda item: PSYCH

- CR 2nd Year PSYCH students have reported that their workload is too high.
- DJ Is the workload academic or otherwise?
- CR Academic. The workload for different tutorials is very uneven, some students have very high workload vs some don't have any at all, and this completely depends on the lecturers taking the tutorial. It isn't possible for anyone to attend the next meeting on 10/04/2019 with the Board of Studies due to Varsity.
- DJ suggests to send an audio file or a group audio file to the board if any of the students can't make it. As the student's opinions need to be heard. It's a bit too late in the year to make minor academic changes, but the students and staff can review what exactly to do after summer.
- CR this is causing mental health issues and the number of students with mental health issues is on the rise.
- SB How are the programme team/school team taking up this issue?
- CR They are trying to reduce it while trying to stay within the guidelines.
- SB Does it get easier in 3rd year?
- CR It does get easier due to exams and dissertation work.
- JK You could ask the new 1^{st} years to start taking up these issues, so this would be issue could be taken up before 2^{nd} year starts.
- CR Get the word out to 1^{st} year students, that 2^{nd} year students should expect and prepare for the following hardships MANAGING EXPECTATIONS is key.

- TG Many students have failed OSCE (Objective Structured Clinical Examination) they would like to know why? Basically feedback. The School of Medicine should make this official. Mock OSCE's have been useful.
- HT could this be released as cohort feedback?
- JK A FAQ would be beneficial to point out to students on where to concentrate and where previous students have had issues.
- TG There also seems an air of panic and distress from $\mathsf{4}^{th}$ years revising, like no other previous year. Anything the Medical school can do to mitigate this would be beneficial.

- DJ suggests a document which would include the rules and regulations for the travel bursaries including and all possible cases and scenarios, and if could the School of Medicine could be obliged to make said document.
- JK Fairness needs to be maintained when handing out money and of course budgetary issues are present.

Agenda item: Year 1 & 2 Exam Timetables		



- TG 1 & 2nd year students have received their timetables and their exams are earlier than expected/told.
- JK –MEDIC and Registry did not know about this and had poor communication.
- DJ This has happened before in a previous year registry sends provisional timetables first, and the school can change it here the School of Medicine could have just sent the provisional timetable out first.
- SB Will double check with the assessment manager if anything could be done.
- DJ The students have a very strong case if the module's syllabus hasn't been completely taught.
- JK There isn't enough time to revise or assimilate.
- DJ If the exams can't be changed, is there anything MEDIC or assessment to do to push forward the teaching or exams.
- SB will check on this.
