

## 2015 Postgraduate Research Experience Survey summary report for the College of Biomedical and Life Sciences n=457 (63.2% response rate)



The Postgraduate Research Experience Survey (PRES) is a national online survey that looks at eight thematic areas: supervision, resources, research culture, progress and assessment, responsibilities, research skills, professional development and overall experiences. The survey also provides the opportunity to ask additional questions about some of the services and facilities specific to Cardiff University that are provided for postgraduate students.





Results are presented as whole numbers for ease of reading, with rounding performed at the last stage of calculation for maximum accuracy. Therefore in some instances, results may not total 100%
