We run training for all Reps, new or continuing. This training will explain your role, how to collect feedback and key parts of your role. This is the chance for you to learn about your role, meet Reps from across the University and ask questions.	Attend 3 Student Staff panels (SSPs) a year. One of the most important parts of your role is to attend SSPs. This is your opportunity to feed back to senior members of staff in your school on issues and feedback that has been brought to you by students.	A massive part of your role is communicating with your cohort! Make it easier for yourself by introducing yourself to them. Ask your SRC if you can introduce yourself in an email or even have a shoutout at the beginning of a lecture.	As a team, we cover a wide range of areas from academic representation and policy to democracy and campaigns. We work in partnership with Cardiff University to advocate for the student voice at every level and give students the opportunity to be to be co-creators of their university experience. The Annual General Meeting is a great opportunity for you to find out what students are talking about and to get involved in the discussion. The meeting is attended by over 900 students from societies and sports teams, to Student Senate and Student Academic Reps. Students vote on policies that will affect the wider student body.	At the end of the academic year you will receive an email from the Student Voice team asking you to fill out the Student Rep end-of-year survey. This gives you an opportunity to tell us how your year has gone and what improvements can be made.

Each school will run a school workshop, this will give you the chance to meet Reps in your school and get to know about school specific feedback and issues. This is also where you will meet your Student Rep Coordinator (SRC).	Make sure you tell your fellow students what happens at SSPs. If a point you have raised at your SSP has been discussed & acted upon, tell your cohort - this is called closing the feedback loop.	Gathering feedback from students forms a key part of the Student Academic Rep role. It is important to remember to reach out to all students when gathering feedback, but you can do this in a way that's most comfortable to you. Please be mindful of making your communication accessible for all students.	Your Student Rep Coordinator (SRC) is your point of contact within your school. It will really help in your role if you can meet them to find out more about the school and what has been brought to SSPs before. If you are unsure who your SRC is please email StudentReps@cardiff.ac.uk .	Speak Week is an annual campaign run by the Students' Union to gather feedback from students at Cardiff University. You can get involved in running a stall for your school. To find out more information contact your Student Rep Coordinator or email StudentReps@Cardiff.ac.uk . Every SSP will elect a Chair and a Vice Chair. They help the facilitation of SSPs, lead the meetings, set agendas, encourage discussion from all Reps and appoint actions. If you would like to become a Chair or Vice Chair, please speak to your SRC.	Chairs from all colleges attend their respective College Forums. This is an opportunity for them to find out about College-wide concerns and issues. When your Chair reaches out for feedback make sure you pass any onto them.	Every month you will receive a Student Voice Newsletter outlining what's on for the next month, key information and other ways to get involved - keep an eye out for that! You will also receive any key Rep information via email so make sure you look out for those emails!	Student Senate meets five times a year to pass policy that affects the student community at Cardiff University. This serves as a great opportunity to pass academic-based policy and help Union decision making. You may be selected as one of the randomly selected SAR senators!	Getting a nomination for an ESLA demonstrates that you have worked really hard in your role and students have found you valuable. You could be nominated for Student Academic Rep of the Year.
